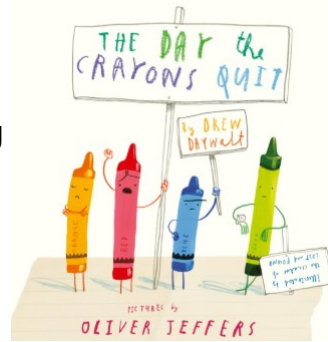


English

Reading

- Know how to decode words using sounding out and blending.
- Know the sequence of events in a story and be able to talk about them.
- Retrieve answers from a text.



Writing

- Know how to structure a sentence with all of the relevant punctuation.
- Include adjectives and verbs in writing.
- Use exclamation and question marks.
- Form letters and numbers correctly.

Geography

- Where North, East, South and West are on a compass.
- The location of the seven continents of the world.
- Their address, including postcode.
- The location of the five oceans of the world
- The name of and locate the four capital cities of England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland
- The following physical features: mountain; lake; island: valley: river; cliff; forest and beach
- Some of the advantages and disadvantages of living in a city or village.

Additional key vocabulary:

Grid references, surrounding, location, landmark, capital city, physical features, urban, rural and continent.

Science

- Know the basic stages in a **life cycle** for animals (including humans)
- Know why exercise, a **balanced, nutritional diet** and good **hygiene** are important for animals, including humans, to **survive**.
- Know that animals, including humans, have **offspring**

Art

- Know that some artists are influenced by things happening around them.
- Use different lines and drawing tools to create pattern and texture.
- Know how to create a piece of art in response to the work of another artist.

Additional key vocabulary: abstract, organic, portrait, sketch and pressure.

PSHE

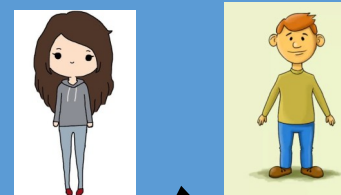
- Learn about **positive play**.
- Know what makes a good friend.
- Learn how to deal with the different **emotions** experienced through friendships.
- Knowing what a safe **relationship** is.
- Knowing how to get help if you feel unsafe.

Maths

- Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words.
- Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations, including the number line.
- Count in steps of 2, 3 and 5 from 0, and in 10s from any number forward and backward.
- Recognise the place value of each digit in a 2-digit number (tens, ones)
- Compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100; use and = signs.
- Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently, and derive and use related facts up to 100.
- Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently, and derive and use related facts up to 100.
- Add and subtract numbers using concrete objects, pictorial representations, and mentally, including: a 2-digit number and 1s, a 2-digit number and 10s, two 2-digit numbers and adding three 1-digit numbers.

Music

- Maintain a steady pulse.
- Copy pulse action sequences.
- Compose call and echo movement sequences.
- Perform movement to music.
- Begin to describe musical features (tempo, mood, pitch and timbre)
- Copy rhythmic and melodic patterns.

PE

- Learn and practice how to control a ball – rolling, catching, throwing and kicking.
- Learn how to move their body in different ways and at different speeds – **weaving** between objects, jumping, skipping, **dodging** and changing **direction** at **pace**.

Computing

- Recognise common uses of **information** technology used beyond school.
- Know how to use **technology** safely and respectfully, keeping personal information private.
- Know how to use technology purposefully to access **digital content**.
- Know how to use the internet to communicate.

RE

- Listen and appreciate stories from the Bible.
- Ask questions about the story and relate some ideas to their own experiences
- Express how Christians show their belief in God as loving and forgiving.

Additional key vocabulary: Parable, forgiveness, prayer and praise.
