


Plot	A secret plan to do something that is wrong.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Started 2<sup>nd</sup> September 1666 and lasted 4 days until 6<sup>th</sup> September 1666</li> <li>There had been a drought</li> <li>Started by Thomas Farynor in a bakery on Pudding Lane</li> <li>The fire spread so quickly because the houses were made from wood and very close together</li> </ul> <p align="center"><b><u>Thomas Farynor</u></b></p> 	
Houses of Parliament	The place where the Government work.		
Government	The group of people that help run our Country.		
Gun powder	Powder that causes an explosion – used to make fireworks.		
Executed	To kill someone as a punishment.		
Bonfire	A fire outdoors to burn rubbish or celebrate an event.

Material	Something things are made from.		
Bakery	A shop that sells bread and cakes.	<b>Design and Technology</b>	<p>Find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.</p>
Unsuccessful	When something fails.	<p>Children will be tasting and evaluation different breads and then designing and making their own.</p>
