End of Year Expectations Year 1

National Curriculum Expectations for children at the <u>end</u> of Year 1 Enjoy reading and listening to stories, poems and non-fiction.

- Relate reading to own experiences.
- Re-read if reading does not make sense.
- Accurate retelling of story.
- Discussion of key events.
- Make predictions of what will happen next in story on basis of what has been read.
- Begin to read with pace & expression, i.e. pause at full stop; raise voice for question
- Knows difference between fiction and nonfiction texts.
- Secure reading of phonics in preparation for phonics screener.



Writing

Enjoy writing for a range of different purposes, including role play.

- Write clearly demarcated sentences.
- Use 'and' to join ideas and simple sentences
- Begin to punctuate sentences using capital letters and a full stop, question mark or exclamation mark.
- Write clearly sequenced sentences
- Use capital letters for names & personal pronoun 'l'.
- Correct formation of lower case lettersstarting and finishing in right place.
- Correct formation of capital letters.
- Correct formation of digits 0-9.

Number and Place Value

• Count to & across 100, forwards & backwards from 0 or 1 and then any number.

Mathematics

- Read & write numbers to 20 in digits & words.
- Read & write numbers to 100 in digits.
- Say 1 more/1 less of numbers up to 100.
- Count in multiples of 1, 2, 5 & 10.

Addition and subtraction

- Know bonds to 10 by heart.
- Add & subtract 1 digit & 2 digit numbers to 20, including zero.
- Add any three 1-digit numbers with a total up to 20.
- Solve simple addition & subtraction problems with apparatus
- Recognise, find and name a half and a quarter of object, shape or quantity using pictures or objects
- Time
- Sequence events in order e.g 1st, 2nd, today, yesterday
- Use language of day, week, month and year.
- Know days of the week
- Tell the time to the hour & half past.
