Attendance

We are always trying to improve our attendance in school as we know that when children are in school regularly, they can get the most out of their learning. This week our school attendance was 97.4%

The national attendance was 92.2%.

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school when they're unwell.

- how to approach difficult conversations to help keep children safe
- who you can contact if you're ever concerned about a child or their family.


